Flu Clinics Now Available to Residents!

Flu season is upon us and the Town of Dighton is stepping up to ensure all residents interested in receiving a flu shot have the opportunity to do so!

Flu Clinic Open to All: On Saturday, Oct. 28 from 9 a.m. to noon, residents can visit the Old Town Hall, 1111 Somerset Ave., to receive a flu shot. Appointments are required and parental consent is needed for anyone under the age of 18. <u>Click here to make your appointment.</u>

The Council On Aging hosted a Flu Clinic on Oct. 18 for residents ages 60+ in need of their flu shot. During the clinic, Town Nurse Nicole Mello conducted blood pressure readings as well. The clinic had a great turnout.

Library Building Project Receives State Grant

The Town's library building project at 207 Main St., the newly-acquired Smith Memorial Hall, has been awarded a \$200,000 grant from the Massachusetts Cultural Council's Cultural Facilities Fund. The grant will fund the replacement of the building's antiquated oil-fired forced hot air heating system with new highefficiency electrical variable refrigerant flow (VRF) HVAC systems.

The CFF funding awarded to Dighton is expected to lessen the town's reliance on the \$323,000 Community Preservation Act (CPA) funding approved at Dighton's June Town Meeting. The CPA funds were allocated to the project to complete the \$700,000 proposed interior and exterior rehabilitation project at Smith Memorial Hall. <u>To learn more about the grant, click here.</u>

Our Town's electricity supply program has been renewed. New prices go into effect in December and will be fixed through November 2025.

Electricity Aggregation Program Update

The Town of Dighton is pleased to announce the renewal of its Community Electricity Aggregation. The program has been renewed with Constellation and features new pricing through November 2025. <u>Updated program pricing can be found online here.</u>

Since Dighton's Community Electricity Aggregation program launched in 2016, over 2,100 participants have cumulatively purchased 30 MWh of renewable energy. In total, participants have collectively saved more than \$3.7 million since the program's launch.

Good Energy, the consultant to the program, will hold virtual public information sessions to answer any questions residents may have and provide more information on the renewal of Dighton Community Electricity Aggregation. These sessions will be held on:

The town applied earlier this month for a Technical Assistance Grant through the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to help further inform and bring additional subject matter data, research, and best practices to these discussions. Town officials will continue sharing news and information regarding additional updates as they become available.
